Since then, she has had a vibrant career all across the globe, performing with the best orchestras and working with some of the greatest musical legends of our time.

Cellist Benedict Klöckner burst onto the classical music scene after winning successive accolades and awards, including first prize at the Grand Prix Emanuel Feuermann. He will be performing a recital at Evermay consisting of works for cello and piano as a part of his tour throughout the United States this fall.

Violist Yoshiko Kawamoto's power, charisma, and virtuosity has garnered her much acclaim worldwide. She currently presides as guest principal violist of the NHK Symphony Orchestra in Japan, and is in demand as soloist and chamber musician. She will be returning to Evermay for a recital of time-honored classical repertoire for the viola.
